A sphere is like a bouncy ball.


A prism is like a building tall.

A cube is like the dice you drop.


Solid figures are here and there.

SECRET WORD:






SECRET WORD ACTION PRACTICE:

Pretend to move and talk like a robot each time you chant the letters in the word. Say the whole word like a robot.
